## **TEACHER PROFESSIONAL LEARNING**

#### InitialLit:

On Monday and Tuesday of this week Ms Oliver, Mrs Hawtin and myself were involved in professional development for InitialLit. An evidence-based whole-class literacy program which provides all children with the essential core knowledge and strong foundations to become successful readers and writers.

InitiaLit is a three-year program, covering the first three years of school which focuses on two main components:

- 1. Phonics, to systematically and explicitly teach the basic alphabetic code in a set sequence. In addition to learning letter-sound correspondences and how these are applied to reading and spelling, children are introduced to common morphemes and simple grammatical concepts.
- 2. Vocabulary, oral language and listening comprehension through quality children's literature.

We look forward to implementing this program starting in our Early Years Classroom from Term 3.

## **DISC PROFILING**

This week, staff participated in Professional Learning around personality types and the behavioural differences between them. Each member completed a profile assessment using DISC questioning. This profiling is used as a non-judgmental tool for discussion of people's behavioural differences.

The use of profiling aids staff in increasing their self-knowledge of how they respond to conflict, what motivates them, what causes them stress and how they solve problems.

Understanding the differences in personality types and the preferred communication styles is important in an organisation as building this understanding aids;

- Improved working relationships by recognising the communication needs of team members,
- Facilitation of better teamwork and teaches productive conflict,
- Enables staff and school leaders to manage more effectively by understanding the dispositions and priorities of colleagues, students and parents.

At Sacred Heart, we will be teaching a number of students the skills in how to manage the virtual farm of "Sacred Heart".

Students will replace livestock and the entering of data relating to 'treatments' aka recess and lunch and "stock movements" aka specialist classes of Italian, Sustainability, Music and Arts will be managed by students.

We look forward to beginning this is one small interactive step towards building the profile of agriculture in our school and the importance of agricultural innovation in our own community.
